Collaborative Digitization Program Names Director

Jill Koelling has been appointed Executive Director of the Collaborative Digitization Program. She has spent most of her curatorial career incorporating the use of digital technology to provide access to primary source materials. During her seven years as Curator of Photographs and Head of Digital Imaging at the Nebraska State Historical Society (NSHS) she worked with society staff to establish the first digital imaging laboratory operated by a regional conservation center. Koelling joins CDP after spending the past year and a half as Curator of Visual Materials at Cline Library, Northern Arizona University. The Collaborative Digitization Program at the University of Denver, established in 1999 as the Colorado Digitization Project, enables access to cultural, historical and scientific heritage collections of the West by building collaboration between archives, historical societies, libraries and museums. The CDP provides assistance to the cultural heritage community through best practice guidelines, workshops, and digitization grant funding.
