### **Kansas City, Kansas to be Google's High-Speed Broadband Test Bed**

Nearly 1,100 cities applied to be selected for Google's new project: to provide a community with Internet access more than 100 times faster than what most Americans have today. Google announced March 30 that their ultra high-speed network will be in Kansas City, Kansas. Google signed a development agreement with the city, and will be working closely with local organizations, businesses and universities to bring a next-generation web experience to the community.

### **State Librarian Jo Budler places moratorium on Harper Collins ebook purchases**

"Because of the potential negative impact of the decision of Harper Collins publishers on customer service, the State Library of Kansas has placed a moratorium on purchasing Harper Collins titles. There are many issues around the "expiration of a title after 26 check-outs," two of which are of immediate interest, i.e., how patron holds and MARC records will be handled upon expiration of a title. Until these and other issues are addressed, the SLK moratorium will remain in place."
